October 2018 Newsletter

October sees the start of a high level of training activity on Salisbury Plain. The Land Warfare Centre, Warminster, are running courses throughout the month culminating in with a very busy week during which the second largest armoured exercise TEAM SPIRIT comes onto the Plain, together with the Brigade Reconnaissance course final exercise BADGERS STRESS. Three large signals units are training throughout the whole of SPTA setting up Brigade and Battle Group Headquarters. 7 Para RHA are conducting a regimental exercise with Light Gun firing into the impact area. Three Recce squadrons and 2 Armoured squadrons are also conducting low level training.

The number of armoured vehicles and heavy wheeled vehicles that will be using the training area during the whole of the month, day and night, will mean that the public are advised to restrict their recreational activities to the public rights of way and privileged tracks. If moving off the public rights of way on foot then additional care should be taken to avoid disrupting military training and placing themselves at risk. Motorists are advised that the tank crossings on all major public roads transiting the Plain will be in regular use and that mud sweepers will be operating on the roads if the weather turns wet.

Byelaw Governance - Antisocial Behaviour

Parish members are encouraged to report all illegal activity on Salisbury plain to the Wiltshire Police. If serious crime is experienced 999 should be dialled, and for all other reports including: illegal off-roading, illegal motor biking, drone use, poaching, hare coursing, petty theft, camping on MoD land, kite flying please call 101 and list the call as 'antisocial behaviour' and a byelaw violation. Access

Access to SPTA is regulated by Salisbury Plain Military Lands, Bulford, Larkhill and Imber Range Byelaws. Always comply with local signs and flags. Rights of way in Range Danger Areas are closed when red flags are flying.

This newsletter is published up to 6 weeks before the event and changes may occur. Access timings for the next week can be found on the SPTA Walks Line: (01980) 674763.

Imber Ranges. The public are excluded at all times, except when the roads are specifically opened. Planned opening dates for 2018 are as follows

What Can You Do To Reduce Crime On Salisbury Plain?

There has been an increase of thefts from motor vehicles that have been left unattended on the training area. Owners are reminded not to leave valubles in plain sight. If any crime is taking place call 999, (or 101) and do not under any circumstances challenge the offenders.

Health and Safety reminder for ALL Military Training Areas and Ranges:

- Do not touch or tamper with Military debris.
- Wash your hands before you eat.
- Clean your footwear before you enter your car or home.

RAZOR WIRE HAZARD

Salisbury Plain Training Area is first and foremost a military training area where high risk activities are conducted on a routine basis. The Byelaws that govern the training area allow members of the public to conduct recreational activities when the areas are not being used for training.

Military units are briefed to ensure that all military debris is to be cleared up after any training activity, including hazardous materials such as razor wire. On occasion units do leave behind military debris, this is usually found and cleared at a later stage by Salisbury Plain Training Patrols or is reported by members of the public for clear up.

In order to protect members of the public from hazardous military debris areas like training buildings, woodlands and plantations these areas are out of bounds in accordance with Byelaw 1981.
