A303 Deptford to Longbarrow maintenance works 13 September to 1 November 2021

National Highways operates, maintains and improves England's motorways and major A roads. This postcard is to let you know we will shortly be carrying out general maintenance of this stretch of the A303 in Wiltshire.

Works will include pot hole repair, drain maintenance, vegetation clearance, sign repair and survey works. The work will take place in rolling phases of 1 to 2 nights.

For the safety of our workforce we'll work overnight when traffic flows are at their lowest. Works will take place overnight Monday to Friday between the hours of 8pm in the evening and 6am the following morning. Where possible, we'll complete noisiest works before 11pm.

Please accept our apologies in advance for any disruption which may be caused.
