Since we last met

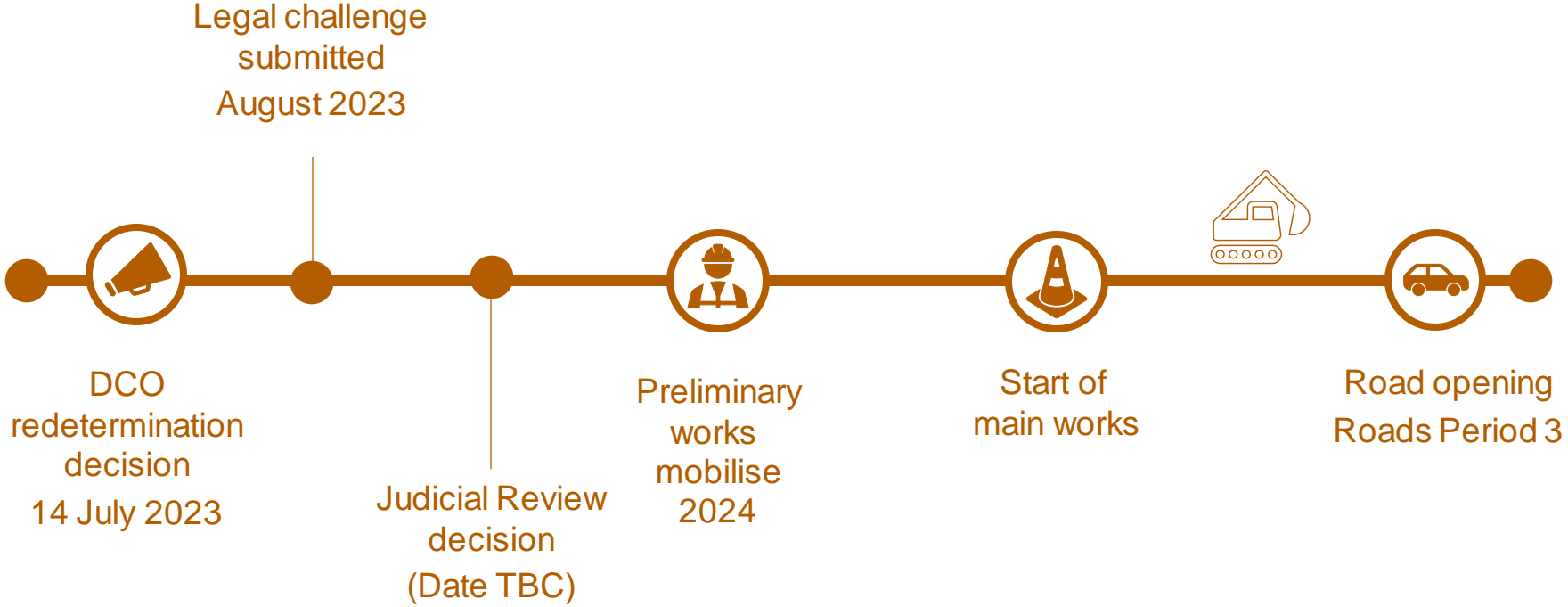
- Legal challenge from Save Stonehenge World Heritage Site was submitted in August 2023.

Who are we?


