

## Action Points for Winterbourne Stoke Parish Council – Extraordinary Meeting of the Parish - 13<sup>th</sup> August 2024

Serial	Issue	Action/ Outcome
1	Installation of Air pollution monitors on A303	PC to write to Environment Agency – asking for installation of a pollution monitor
2	Winterbourne Stoke classed as an urban area by National Highways	FOIA request submitted to National Highways and is awaiting response
3	Outcome of the legal appeal against the tunnel scheme due September/ October	Await outcome.
4	Shrewton Parish Council to press for changes to Rollestone crossroads.	Monitor situation.
5	A303 not fit for purpose as a trunk road.	Link to Serial 2. FOIA submitted to National Highways and is awaiting response
6	Rat runs through local villages.	<p>Wiltshire Council to be invited to implement scheme to use ANPR cameras to fine rat runners – perhaps by introducing a ULEZ for the World Heritage Site and environs – exemptions for local traffic.</p> <p>Engage with National Highways on ULEZ zone for the A303 – from Amesbury to Berwick Down – raise money and deter some users altogether.</p> <p>Engage with English Heritage, National Trust, Wiltshire Council, World Heritage Site Committee and UNESCO on using a ULEZ to reinforce the Outstanding Universal Values of the World Heritage Site.</p>

7	Cllr Kevin Daley keen to know what the villagers want regarding the A303 scheme.	Invite Kevin to future PC meetings. Invite Kevin to contact Devon Council regarding views from Exeter and Plymouth councils on economic impacts of delays on A303.
8	Reduce the speed limit on the A303 in Winterbourne Stoke.	Examine the criteria and submit a case to Wiltshire Council. Invite Wiltshire Police to conduct speed checks. A 20 MPH limit was suggested, but is a non-starter (If observed 85th percentile speeds are above 24 mph, then it is unlikely a 20 MPH speed limit would be approved)
9	Cameras needed to ensure safety of pedestrian crossing in Winterbourne Stoke.	PC to contact National Highways
10	Design of Longbarrow Roundabout contributes to delays on A303. See Serial 7.	Engage with National Highways Request Wiltshire Council support.
11	State of the bridge over the River Till on A303	Initial inspection reveals spalling concrete and rusting steel rebar reinforcements. Link to Serial 5. FOIA request submitted to National Highways and is awaiting response
12	Engage with Cllr Robert Yuill on the views of English Heritage and National Trust on cancellation of the tunnel scheme.	LHFIG not relevant to this serial
13	Inform Danny Kruger MP of the outcomes from the meeting and request his support to resolve the local traffic issues.	Letter drafted to MP.
14	Vehicle controlled traffic lights are needed on the A303 and Church Street, to allow vehicles to more easily leave the village via Church Street – the only exit available.	PC to raise with National Highways and Wiltshire Council – possibly move existing pedestrian-controlled crossing eastwards to have a single set of lights at Church Street. Too expensive for LHFIG and PC!
