

Officers have been engaging with staff at the Wiltshire Wildlife Hospital to gain information relating to poaching and hare coursing, as they often treat animals harmed by these activities. PCSO HOUSE and PC COX also had a chance to visit an injured dove they took to the hospital in August, who happily was doing much better and was nearly ready to be released!

Officers have assisted Wiltshire Council with their work regarding illegal trading on Byway 12, near Stonehenge.

On Friday 27th September members of the Neighbourhood worked together with the Rural Crime Team and members of the public to carry out an overnight operation targeting poachers and hare coursers. Earlier in the day a vehicle believed to have been used in such activity was seized.

Priority Patrols

PCSO HOUSE and PC COX have been continuing to engage with the residents of Steeple Langford and Hanging Langford who were burgled last month, and along with the visits have continued their increased patrols in the Langfords.

Patrols have also been increased in Shrewton in response to ongoing community tensions.

Speed Enforcement

Unfortunately the Speed Enforcement Team have not been able to carry out checks in the Amesbury Rural area in September. We hope these will resume in October.
